




UCLA POST-BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM IN CLASSICS

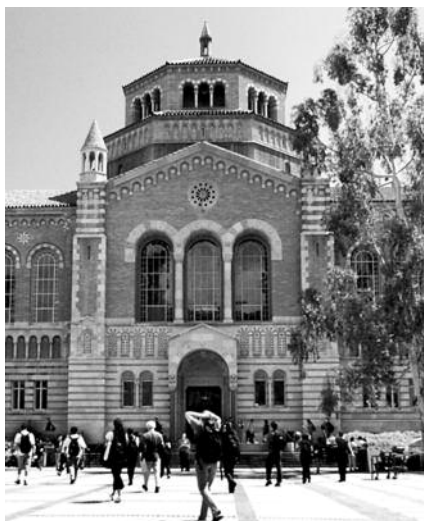

Entering its 13th year, this program is designed to prepare students who already have a B.A. and are seeking additional language study in Greek and Latin for admission to graduate programs in Classics and related fields. Students who meet the program's entrance requirements can expect to earn the certificate (complete the program) at the end of one academic year of study.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- **Full-time study** for three consecutive quarters consisting of at least three undergraduate and/or graduate courses approved by the Post-Baccalaureate Faculty Advisor. Courses carry transferable credit and, depending on the admitting institution, may apply to graduate degree requirements.
- **Students have the option** of choosing between a Classics program, which includes both Greek and Latin, or a Latin program, which concentrates on Latin. Please refer to "Program Requirements."
- **Post-Baccalaureate Seminar** taught by a UCLA faculty member and exclusive to students in the program. This seminar culminates in the completion of a research paper for the purpose of submission as a writing sample for graduate school applications.
- **Supervision by Professor Shane Butler, a full-time member** of the Classics faculty at UCLA, who will serve as advisor to all students as well as instructor for the Fall Quarter Post-Baccalaureate Seminar.
- **Small class size** of 15-20 students allows Post-Baccalaureate students to study closely with UCLA faculty and UCLA graduate students.
- **Certificate and transcript** issued upon successful completion of program.
- **Graduates of the program** have been admitted to graduate study in Classics, Philosophy, History, Archaeology, Religion, and Near Eastern Languages and Cultures at UC Santa Barbara; Vanderbilt University; Berkeley; UCLA; University of Chicago; Harvard University; University of Michigan; New York University; University of Pittsburgh; Princeton University; University of Southern California; and Yale University.

- **Full-time status as a UCLA Extension student** with provision of campus student services, such as Bruin Online (UCLA email and computer access), campus parking privileges, UCLA library privileges, and access to UCLA's extensive student recreational facilities.
- **Financial Aid**
Federal financial aid (subsidized and unsubsidized Stafford Loans) is available. To request a loan application packet, please call UCLA Extension Financial Aid Office, Monday-Friday, 9am-12pm or 2-4:30 pm at (310) 825-4246. Financial aid students may select a payment schedule for the final tuition fee of \$6,700 in accordance with Federal Financial Aid disbursement policy.

- **Tax Credit**

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- **Option A: Classics**
Minimum requirement for completion of the program is 36 units of course work comprising the following: The Classics Post-Baccalaureate Seminar, at least one intermediate-level or upper-division reading course in both Greek and Latin each quarter, and additional courses in Classics, Ancient History, or other disciplines directly related to the program. More advanced students may take graduate seminars in the fields of Classics, Greek, and Latin only with the approval of the Faculty Advisor and instructor of the seminar. Students should expect to complete the program in three quarters. The program must be completed within two academic years.
- **Option B: Latin**
Minimum requirement for completion of the program is 36 units of course work comprising at least two intermediate-level or upper-division reading courses in Latin each quarter. The remaining courses may include the Classics Post-Baccalaureate Seminar and courses in Classics, Ancient History, or other disciplines directly related to the program. More advanced students may take graduate seminars in the fields of Classics, Latin, and Greek with the approval of the Faculty Advisor and instructor of the seminar. Students should expect to complete the program in three quarters. The program must be completed within two academic years.



ABOUT UCLA

UCLA is one of the nation's top-ranked research institutions and, with 30,000 students, is the largest of the University of California campuses. The graduate program in the Department of Classics was ranked among the top 10 in the country by the most recent assessment of the National Research Council.

UCLA is located in a park-like setting on the west side of Los Angeles. Five miles from the Pacific Ocean and minutes from Beverly Hills, the university is adjacent to Westwood Village, a commercial and entertainment center. The city and university offer the student of Classics many resources, including UCLA's own excellent libraries and special collections, as well as the Getty Center, located nearby, and the Huntington Library in Pasadena.

UCLA Extension is an entirely self-supporting, not-for-profit division of UCLA devoted to continuing higher education. One of the largest single-campus continuing higher education programs in the country, it advances the missions of the university within the larger local, national, and international communities. Students in the UCLA Post-Baccalaureate Program in Classics enroll through UCLA Extension.



ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

Bachelor's degree

Letters of recommendation from two college instructors

- **Option A: Classics**
At least one college-level year of Attic Greek and one college-level year of Latin.
- **Option B: Latin**
At least one college-level year of Latin

Note: Recent completion of these language requirements is preferred, supported by academic transcripts, and must be equivalent to a year of college-level Attic Greek or Latin. Applicants whose language preparation took place more than one year ago are strongly advised to take an intensive yearlong or summer course in Attic Greek or Latin to rebuild language skills prior to admission.

FEES

\$7,200 (total for three quarters: Fall, Winter, Spring)

Because the program is limited to 10-12 students, a nonrefundable deposit of \$500 is required to reserve space in the program. Deposit is due within three weeks of acceptance. **Balance (\$6,700) is due by September 11, 2009.** Extraordinary provisions will be made for students granted financial aid. Fees are not refundable after the first day of class except in cases of unforeseeable changes in life circumstances that are reasonable and documented.

HOUSING

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The Post-Baccalaureate Program in Classics is approved for full-time international students. The program requires a TOEFL score of 600 for the paper-based test and 250 for the computer-based test. International students must carry a full-time course load of 12 units each quarter, purchase mandatory health insurance, and conform to all rules and regulations governing their F-1 student status. The application deadline is April 1, 2009; however, applications will be accepted after that date until the program fills. Students will be advised of the Admissions Committee decision within one month of the deadline or, if submitted later, within one month of receipt of application.
