General Ecampus course website information

- 1) Login to Ecampus at the following URL: <http://ecampusce.humnet.ucla.edu>
Username: 9-digit UID (no spaces or dashes)
Password: last 4 digits of Social Security (or 2-digit month + 2-digit day of birthday)
- 2) If you have login problems or other technical difficulties with Ecampus, consult the ecampus online help pages: <http://www.humnet.ucla.edu/itc/ecampushelp/>
or fill out a webform on line at: <http://www.humnet.ucla.edu/itc/ecampushelp/contact.html>
- 3) Students may also go to the CDH computer labs (basement of LuValle) between 10am and 6pm, Monday through Friday, for assistance with Ecampus login issues. CDH lab consultants are authorized to check enrollments and reset passwords, but they are not authorized to add courses to accounts.

Tips: Bookmark and use the URL in #1 for all your humanities courses.

Logon early in the quarter to make sure that your Ecampus account works.
